


Historically, the Rogation Days are devoted to prayer and fasting, with common use of the Litany of the Saints in the Roman tradition, or the Great Litany amongst Lutherans and Anglicans. The word *rogation* comes from the Latin *rogare*, or "to ask," and *rogatio*, the Latin legal term for asking or posing a question.

Rogation days are divided into two classes: the major and minor. The Major Rogation is a Christianisation of a former pagan observance called the Robigalia, which included the sacrifice of a dog to appease the god Robigus, a sort of patron god of agricultural disease, particularly wheat rust. This day falls on April 25th.

The Minor Rogation was introduced by Mamertus, Bishop of Vienne in France around the year 470. These are the three days preceding the Ascension of our Lord, 40 days after Easter Day. By the early 500s, the observance of these special days had spread throughout France.

During these days, farmers would often have their crops blessed by the local parish priest.





Things common to the observance of the Rogation Days included "beating the bounds," a practice in which the parish priest, accompanied by the choirboys, processional cross, and incense, would process around the geographical boundary of the parish and pray for its safety in the duration of the year.


In our own day, the Minor Rogation Days – again, a Major Rogation day remains on April 25th – are an occasion to ask God's special blessing upon the seedtime and agricultural endeavors of our people. It is a time to ask God to form our hearts in gratitude for the blessings of the land, that we may be so led to share its bounty with those in

need and conserve its resources for generations to come. On these days we give special thanks to God for those who work the land so that we all may have our daily bread. Thus, in this liturgy, there is a blessing of hands for those who plant and tend the crops of the field and the fruits of the earth.

If you are interested in having your farm or garden blessed during Rogation (May 6 through May 8), please contact Pastor Moyers or the church office.

On Sunday, May 26, we will be recognizing members of our congregation who are 2024 graduates. Our 9:30 am service will be a joint service with Grace. On the next page we have a spotlight on our graduates and their future plans.
