A Reading of Matthew 21:1-11

The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

When Jesus and his disciples had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, `The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately." This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying,

"Tell the daughter of Zion, Look, your king is coming to you, humble, and mounted on a donkey, and on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting,

"Hosanna to the Son of David!

Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!


Hosanna in the highest heaven!"



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Eucharistic Prayer

Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when he was betrayed, took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it his disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me."

In the same way also, after supper he took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to his disciples, saying: "Drink of it, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."



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Endowment Fund

The mission of St. Paul's Cordova is to be led by the Spirit of Jesus: praise and worship the Trinity; grow our membership with faith and love; and share our blessings with all God's people. In following this mission, St. Paul's established an Endowment Fund to receive gifts and bequests of "faithful stewards" to strengthen the ongoing mission of our church.

Contributions to the fund strengthens the congregation and provides a legacy for generations to come. The Endowment Policy requires recognition of contributions in the newsletter and bulletin on or near Palm Sunday. During 2022, there were no contributions to the Endowment Fund. Faithful stewards have contributed \$25,083.50 to the Endowment Fund since its inception in 2015.

St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church encourages its members and friends to think prayerfully about how they can help maintain the congregation's ministry in the long term.
