Heading into September 2023

I am taking a pause from "Things Old and New" in order to highlight an event which will be just a few days away when you read this. Sunday, September 10th is "God's work. Our hands." Sunday. This time, it is an even more special event in that it is the 10th anniversary of this Sunday which has become a celebration of the Church's ministry in the larger world.

"God's Work. Our Hands." became a catch-phrase to help us in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America form a self-understanding that our faith in Christ frees us to live lives that are marked by a care and concern for the world around us, both in our local area and across the globe. The danger for Christians, especially American Christians, who are so overlyindulged in a false ethic of Christian faith that says "it's all about me," is that we treat Jesus as a private Lord and Savior. "I got my salvation and that's the end of it." But that is not a way of living Jesus wants for us. Jesus wants us to be freed in him that we may respond in gratitude by caring for our neighbor and our entire world.

Thus, 10 years ago, the ELCA began this initiative called "God's Work. Our Hands." The concept quotes Luther in the Large Catechism, "We receive our blessings not from other human creatures, but from God, through them. Creatures are only the hands, channels, and means through which God bestows all blessings."

In the congregations of our shared area ministry, "God's Work. Our Hands." is combined longer standing celebrations surrounding the beginning of the school year and the Sunday School year. We observe this day of service at the same time we gather for the annual picnic and the blessing of backpacks and teachers at the Talbot Ag Center.

This year, as our shared service project, we are assembling school supply packs for Lutheran World Relief to send all over the world in their school supply program.

The School Supply Kits made for Lutheran World Relief will reach children in all sorts of places from Africa, to Asia, to Ukraine – places where access to educational supplies is limited and places where war and devastation have destroyed the tools children and teachers so desperately need.





Kathy Barletta and Susan Behrens Talbot Ag Center/Rally Day Lee Heinsohn and Lee Moore Henry and Lyn Hollingsworth Shortly before his death, 80-year-old farmer Hody Childress asked his daughter to continue a practice he'd quietly conducted for years: taking a \$100 bill to a local pharmacist on the first of every month. For years, Childress anonymously came to the aid of neighbors in Geraldine, Alabama, who couldn't afford medications. "Don't tell a soul where the money came from," he instructed store owner Brooke Walker. "If they ask, just tell them it's a blessing from the Lord."

Thanks to the farmer's generosity, Walker could fill prescriptions for about 24 uninsured or underinsured people each year. "I was honored he allowed me to do that," she said, "and it really encouraged me to do the same in my life."

Childress wasn't wealthy but "always gave what he could," said daughter Tania Nix. "I think he felt like he couldn't not give," she added. "Giving that way, that just got on his heart." After word spread about Childress' generosity, other people were inspired to perform stealth outreach and a fund was established in his name. As many may already know, The Garden Basket- the florist that works with St Pauls to provide beautiful flowers each Sunday will be going out of business, so we are left with a decision to make. I would like members' input/suggestions on what our flowers will look like moving forward:

Check and comment below-

Artificial Flowers- to change with each season Families to supply the flowers once a month Flowers only for special occasions- birthdays, anniversaries etc.

Find a new florist- I have called Robins Nest. They will deliver on Saturdays and depending on the size of the container and how many flowers we want- \$20-25/vase and \$10 delivery fee. We are looking at \$60 or a bit more.

I have also called Garden Treasures- they will do 2 vases for \$40 plus \$10 delivery fee, \$50 total. + any additional cost for possible containers/canister flowers sit in Please remember these numbers may change.
