
- small cereal boxes

God's got you

In Roman 4 Paul writes: "If it is the adherents of the law who are to be the heirs, faith is null and the promise is void. ... For this reason the promise depends on faith, in order that it may rest on grace" (v. 14, 16, NRSV). Here and elsewhere, Paul firmly explains that we are saved through God's grace, or unconditional love, made known most profoundly in Jesus Christ. But this passage raises a question: If belief (trust, faith) reckons us as righteous before God, what if we don't trust, can't believe, have lost all faith?

Pastor Martin Luther (1483-1546) assures us that even this is a gift of God: "I believe that by my own understanding or strength I cannot believe in Jesus Christ my Lord or come to him, but instead *the Holy Spirit has* called me through the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, made me holy and *kept me in the true faith*" (*The Small Catechism*; emphasis added). Later in Romans, Paul declares that when we feel so lost (unbelieving, lacking in faith) that we don't even know how to pray, the "Spirit himself intercedes for us" (8:26, NIV). Rest assured, dear one: God's got you.

What: 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Wednesdays Adult Christian Education 4th Wednesdays Mission Team

On the first three Wednesdays of the month, we will offer ways for us all to deepen our understanding of our faith as we draw closer to God in search and study through the Holy Scriptures, the Lutheran tradition, and the story of the people of God throughout the ages. Through Bible studies, historical and theological topics, and spirituality explorations we will explore what it means to be people who have been given the free gift of faith in Christ.

On fourth Wednesdays, our Mission Team will work on ways of creating community ministry opportunities in which ALL of our members and friends may be engaged – sharing the love of Christ with those around us and those in need. This new Mission Team, led by Amber Vitanovec and Vicki Zobel, is already working on the Blessing Box project and has more potential projects in the pipeline! Curious? Ask them, or come on a 4th Wednesday!

Question: What if I can only come on the 2nd Wednesday of the month?

That's fine! Come! While the series at any given time will be related to the preceding sessions, it is always ok to come when able. We understand that life can get very busy. Most of our topics and series will be in four-session packages – with no more than eight sessions. Jumping in for what interests you or mid-series as time allows is just fine.

Question: What if I really want to join in the Mission Team work, but not the study series, or vice versa?

That's fine, too! Everyone has faith formation and spirituality needs that are different and we all live our baptismal calling differently. Our hope is that in Grace 5:15 we find a way to include all our parish family in their Christian walk.



Chocolate Chip Zucchini Bread by Lois Clark

3/4 c. sugar 3 T. oil 2 large eggs 1 c. applesauce 2 c. flour 1/4 c. cocoa 1 1/4 tsp. baking soda
1 tsp cinnamon
1/2 tsp salt
1 1/2 c finely grated zucchini
1/2 c. chocolate chips

Preheat oven to 350. Grease and flour $9 \ge 5 \ge 3$ inch pan or 3 small loaf pans. Place the first 3 ingredients in the mixing bowl. Beat at low speed until blended. Stir in the applesauce. Sift the next 5 ingredients. Add and beat until moist. Stir in the zucchini and chips. Bake 60 minutes for the large loaf and 30 minutes for the small loaves. Cool 10 minutes. Remove from pan(s).



Marinated Tomatoes by Marian Davis

1/4 c. vinegar plus 2 T.Oregano to taste1/4 c. oilSugar to taste2 T. water1 pkg. Italian Good Seasons All Natural Salad Dressing Mix1/8 tsp. or to taste garlic powder

Combine all ingredients well.






