Eucharistic Prayer

We ask you: remember the perfect and eternal sacrifice through which, in Christ, you have reconciled us with yourself. Grant that we may be united, with the Blessed Virgin Mary, and all the saints, into one body, and be made a perfect living sacrifice in Christ.

Through him, and with him, and in him, by the power of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
